### FROM PASTOR ROB

My family does not wait for the cavalry to arrive. If we can fix a problem – even if the job belongs to someone else – we will.

I recently found myself thinking about a storm that happened the year between college and seminary. In Iowa, it barely registered as a bad storm, but it did knock a few dead and dying limbs off trees in our neighborhood. The limbs blocked some of the roads, not really stopping anyone but making it harder to get around or to the main road.

My mom and I did what we always do; we started fixing the problem. We moved limbs and broke down what we could without proper tools – not fully cleaning or disposing of the waste but at least getting it off the road so people could start moving a bit freer that day instead of waiting for the city or property owners.

This memory would probably have faded into the black hole of my forgetfulness if one small thing had not happened. A car full of young people – roughly my age at the time – drove past and said, "Hey, the city will take care of that."

And they would have within a couple of days of the storm, whisked away the debris and the neighborhood would be normal again. That day, though, either we did it or people would have struggled to get around.

As a congregation, we just lived through a 16-month storm that has not ended yet and has brought devastation beyond a few downed trees. We will not know the extent of the damages – to relationships, to our church, to our own mental health – for a significant amount of time. We have a lot of 'cleanup' to do.

As we start this cleanup and start to see the work that needs doing, I encourage you to not think about who has done it before or whose job it might be; instead, think about how you can start the process and get us over a hump or two. "We've always done it that way!"

### **Pentecost Giving Report**

The Pentecost Offering helps the church encourage, develop, and support its young people, and also addresses the needs of at-risk children. We have been collecting this offering during the month of June and our total collection was \$260. Of that total 60% which is \$156 was sent to Whitewater Presbytery Mission Agency and 40% which is \$104 will stay in our Pentecost Fund for our Mission Team to distribute.

#### Peace and Global Witness

The special giving opportunity for September and October is the Peace and Global Witness program. It provides tools and resources to help our members and friends of the church to deal with conflict. Together we can aspire to being faithful peacemakers — in all times, in all ways.





### Wellspring Interfaith Social Services

Grace has many outstanding Mission Partners. Some are new and some we have worked with for decades. One of our oldest is Wellspring Interfaith Social Services, who are, "People of faith working together to support and enrich the lives of Fort Wayne's central city residents." From its beginning in 1968, the organization quickly expanded to offer a variety of programs focusing on food and clothing insecurity, and the educational, social, physical and recreational needs of at-risk individuals. In 2020, Wellspring directly impacted the lives of over 20,000 clients throughout Allen County – the most ever in this organization's history. Grace has worked with Wellspring in a variety of ways. In addition to our regular annual donation, the shopping cart in our Narthex is always overflowing due the the generosity of Grace's members and items are taken to down to them regularly at 1316 Broadway. We have also served a number of dinners to some of their clients, put on musical performances, and we found that Pastor Rob calls a mean game of Bingo which their clientele really enjoys! Like so many things, Grace's involvement with them has been limited over the last year, but we look forward to again working closely with Executive Director Melissa Rinehart and her outstanding staff.


