Lighting of the First Advent Candle – The Candle of Restoration

This year the lighting of the Advent Candles will reflect the “Four R’s” in our Christian life. They are Restoration, Repentance, Resurrection and Rejoicing. Our scripture passage for the lighting of the Candle of Restoration is taken from Isaiah 2:1-5. Listen now to the word of God.

The word that Isaiah son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem. In days to come the mountain of the Lord’s house shall be established as the highest of the mountains and shall be raised above the hills; all the nations shall stream to it. Many peoples shall come and say, ‘Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob; that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths.’ For out of Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. He shall judge between the nations, and shall arbitrate for many peoples; they shall beat their swords into ploughshares, and their spears into pruning-hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more. O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the

light of the Lord!

Lighting the Candle of Restoration

“Rock the Block”, “Windy City Rehab”, “Rehab Addict” and “Restored by the Fords”, are all shows on HGTV which deal with home restoration. Every show features a home that is broken down and in need of serious repair. After weeks of hard work which sometimes include taking a home down to the bare studs, it soon becomes magically restored to its previous glory. In some instances, the house is in better shape than when it was first built!

In our passage from Isaiah, we see where God will bring restoration to a broken world. Swords and spears will now become pruning hooks. Nations will no longer go to war against nations. A new world order will come into being and God’s promise to his people will never be broken.

Advent is a time when we focus our attention on God’s work in this broken world. It is a time of waiting in silence, a time of looking for the salvation that God has promised, and a time of knowing that God can not only take our old life and restore it, but more importantly make our life entirely new due to our relationship in Christ Jesus his Son, our Savior.

Prayer:

Let us pray. Dear God, the prophets of old had a vision of the restoration of the whole human family. They saw in the birth of the coming one, the establishment of the justice that makes it possible for all people to thrive, to reach their God-given potential, to experience the healing and joy that God intends for all creation. O Lord, help us to embrace the restoration and healing God has promised to us. Amen.


